Hello, Mr. Warren:

I am acknowledging your decision to terminate the broadcast of "To Be Equal."

Nearly sixty-(60) individual programs are routinely broadcast on CTI22. To categorize CTI22 as a station that caters to a cluster of "fringe" broadcasts is not only inaccurate, but belittles the clear majority of programs on CTI22 that have absolutely nothing to do with the interests and/or rhetoric espoused by the AAEN or the Urban League of Nebraska. Point of fact, whether intentional or not, it was not that long ago that one or more of the "fringe" programs you criticize also brought a third-party into their broadcast, and CTI22 issued the same directive.

Notably, to mitigate this issue, you could have elected to include AAEN as a named party in the contract, at a revised contract rate. This option is available at your discretion. Again, CTI22 has absolutely no bias against the AAEN. Of course, the Urban League of Nebraska is welcome to return to CTI22 as a regular program producer or to broadcast special events; and the door remains open to AAEN.

Finally, how do you wish to manage the four remaining broadcasts?
