Introduction

Nebraska's racial and ethnic diversity increases with the growth of minority populations. This report provides an overview of Nebraska's minority population growth between 2010 and 2018. It also provides a data source for population-based disease prevention and health promotion programs.

Race and Ethnicity in the United States Census

Race and ethnicity, as defined by the United States Census Bureau and the Federal Office of Management and Budget (OMB), are self-identification data items in which residents choose the race or races with which they most closely identify, and indicate whether or not they are of Hispanic or Latino origin (ethnicity).

The racial classifications used by the U.S. Census Bureau adhere to the October 30, 1997, Federal Register Notice entitled "Revisions to the Standards for the Classification of Federal Data on Race and Ethnicity" issued by the OMB. The OMB requires five minimum categories (White, Black or African American, American Indian and Alaska Native, Asian, and Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander) for race. The race categories are described below with a sixth category, "some other race," added with OMB approval. In addition to the five race groups, the OMB also states that respondents should be offered the option of selecting one or more races. The following definitions are provided by OMB and the U.S. Census Bureau to identify race.

White: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, the Middle East, or North Africa. It includes people who indicate their race as "White" or report entries such as "Irish," "German," "Italian," "Lebanese," "Near Easterner," "Arab," or "Polish."

Black or African American: A person having origins in any of the Black racial groups of Africa. It includes people who indicate their race as "Black," "African American," or "Negro," or provide written entries such as "African American," "Afro American," "Kenyan," "Nigerian," or "Haitian."

American Indian and Alaska Native: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North and South America (including Central America) and who maintain tribal affiliation or community attachment.

Asian: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, or the Indian subcontinent, including, for example, Cambodia, China, India, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Pakistan, the Philippine Islands, Thailand and Vietnam. It includes "Asian Indian," "Chinese," "Filipino," "Korean," "Japanese," "Vietnamese," and "Other Asian."

Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Hawaii, Guam, Samoa or other Pacific Islands. It includes people who indicate their race as "Native Hawaiian," "Guamanian," or "Chamorro," "Samoan," and "Other Pacific Islander."

Two or more races: People may have chosen to provide two or more races either by checking two or more race response check boxes, by providing multiple write-in responses, or by some combination of check boxes and

write-in responses.

Race and ethnicity were considered separate and distinct identities, with Hispanic origin asked as a separate question. Thus, in addition to their race or races, all respondents are categorized by membership in one of two ethnicities: Hispanic or Latino, and non-Hispanic. Percentages for the various race categories add up to 100 percent and should not be combined with the Hispanic percent.

Hispanic or Latino: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Cuba, Mexico, Puerto Rico, South or Central America, or other Spanish culture or origin regardless of race. People who identify their origin as "Spanish," "Hispanic," or "Latino" may be of any race.

Non-Hispanic White: Individuals who responded "No, not Spanish/Hispanic/Latino" and reported "White" as their only entry in the race question.


Data Source

The data presented in this report are based on the U.S. Census Bureau Population Division.

Nebraska Population Distribution

Nebraska continues to become more diverse. According to the U.S. Census Bureau, the 2017 Nebraska population was estimated at 1,929,268. Approximately 79% of the population was White. Almost 5% of the population was African American, approximately 1% was American Indian, 2.6% of the population was Asian, and 2.3% were more than one race. Approximately 11% of the population was Hispanic or Latino.



Nebraska Population Distribution 18 Years and Over

Almost 98% of the population identifies as one race. Of those who identified as one race, including those who identify as Hispanic, 88.3% are White, 5.1% are African American, 1.5% are American Indian, and 2.7% are Asian. Of those who are non-Hispanic, 4.8% are African American, 2.6% are Asian, and 0.8% are American Indian. Nine percent of the population 18 years and older are Hispanic, leaving almost 91% of the population 18 years and older to be non-Hispanic. The table below depicts Nebraska's population by race.

Minority Population Change


The minority population in Nebraska has been increasing more rapidly than the non-Hispanic White population. According to the U.S. Census Bureau, from 2010 to 2018, Nebraska's racial/ethnic minority population grew from 297,376 to 376,761, a 26.7% increase while the non-Hispanic White population had only a 0.9% increase. A detailed review is provided in the following table and figure.




Nebraska Minority Groups: Hispanic or Latinos

Hispanics had a larger proportion of young people and a smaller proportion of older people, whereas the non-Hispanic White population was more evenly distributed across age groups until age 70 and older. In 2018, 81.2% of Hispanics were younger than 45 years old with approximately one-third (33.6%) of Hispanics under 15 years old and only 4% were 65 years and older. In the same year, just over half (56%) of non-Hispanic Whites were younger than 45 with 18.4% under 15 years old, while 18.3% were 65 and older. The chart below provides a comparison of the Hispanic population and the non-Hispanic White population in Nebraska by age.






Nebraska Minority Groups: Asians

Asians were the fastest-growing minority group, with a 57.3% population increase during the 2010-2018 period. In 2010, the Asian population accounted for 1.8% of the total Nebraska population and accounted for 2.6% in 2018. Over three-quarters of the Asian population were under the age of 45 (78.2%), 24.4% were under the age of 15, and 5.9% were 65 years and older.




Nebraska Minority Groups: Black or African Americans

According to the U.S. Census, there were 92,902 non-Hispanic African Americans in Nebraska in 2018. This number represented approximately 4.8% of the total Nebraska population and saw an increase of 13.4% between 2010 and 2018. Compared to the White population, 30.3% of the African American population was under the age of 15, 75.4% were younger than 45 years, and 6.8% were 65 years and older.


The chart below illustrated the African American population by age and sex. There were similar number of males and females within each age group.


Nebraska Minority Groups: American Indians

In 2018, there were 16,133 non-Hispanic American Indians in Nebraska, representing 0.8% of the total population. The American Indian population saw an increase of 8.6% between 2010 and 2018. Compared to the White population, 29% of the American Indian population was under the age of 15, 72.3% were under 45, and 7.9% were 65 years and older.

Nebraska Gender and Age Characteristics

Compared with the non-Hispanic White population, Nebraska's minority population had a larger proportion of young people and a smaller proportion of older people. In 2018, nearly one-third (31.3%) of the minority population was under 15 years old, about 78.3% were younger than 45, while only 5.2% were 65 and older. In the same year, 18.4% of non-Hispanic Whites were under 15 years old, 56% were younger than 45, and 18.3% were 65 and older.



County Minority Population

There is a large variation in the geographic distribution of the racial and ethnic minority populations across Nebraska. In 2010, Thurston, Dakota, Colfax, Dawson, and Hall Counties had some of the highest percentages of individuals who were racial or ethnic minorities. Percentages in these counties range from 35 to 65.4% minority, while Rock, Grant, Keya Paha, McPherson, and Garfield Counties had some of the lowest percentages, ranging from 2.4% to 3.2%. Additionally, in 2010, 45 counties in Nebraska had minority populations of 5% or greater; by 2018, that number increased to 72 counties. All counties saw some growth in minority populations with the exception of McPherson (0%), Greeley (-2%), and Arthur (-14.6%) counties.
